I have called your office twice to find out how I can help with your client, Mr. Perry. I have seen him 3 times for an evaluation and treatment. I have diagnosed him with Chronic Post Traumatic Stress Disorder based on his legal problems. Since I believe he has told you how he has gotten to this point, I shall not bother you by repeating the history. I am writing you to assure you that based on my knowledge of Mr. Perry, he is not dangerous to others. I have worried that he could be a danger to himself because he has had some suicidal thoughts and have urged him to get admitted at the VA hospital. He was evaluated by a psychiatrist there and a psychologist. I believe they could get you a copy of their findings. If you need a copy of my complete evaluation I will send you that also.

I am currently seeing Mr. Perry for Individual psychotherapy and medication management. Apparently, his court case on August 7, 2018 will not be dismissed. I do not presume to know the legalities of this case, but I do know that Post Traumatic Stress Disorder is at its worst. This man is a Marine and before the alleged offense he had never been in any trouble. He ran a successful business venture and it is unlikely that he will risk this for the offense that he allegedly did.

I am concerned about his mental and physical well-being, not to mention his future as an individual. This is not affecting just him but his mother and other relatives. Short of murder, rape or drug dealing, I believe that an unproven offense does not merit this much legal complications. I would urge you, Judge, to please consider dropping this case and giving him a chance to be a productive citizen.
